

A Student Guide to Plagiarism Sanctions

1. Introduction

The aim of the IMM Graduate School plagiarism prevention process is to create a learning environment where academic integrity is upheld and where students are continuously educated on the skills required to produce authentic work. Students who plagiarised will be further educated on the academic skills required to avoid plagiarism. The occurrence of plagiarism will also have an impact on the mark of the assessment.

2. Compulsory Academic Skills Development module

It is compulsory for any IMM Graduate School student who committed plagiarism to complete or repeat the Academic Skills Development (ASD) module. This module provides students with further education on the academic skills required to identify and avoid plagiarism. Studentswho completed the module in the past will be offered the opportunity to repeat the module at no additional cost

3. Sanctions applicable to the different types of plagiarism

3.1. Undergraduate students: An eActivity quiz or online timed assessments

eActivities and online assessments must be completed independently without third party assistance. Students are allowed to use the internet, textbooks and the study guide. However, all answers provided must be in the own words and writing style of the student. If an answer or any section thereof is copied from another source, it will be regarded as plagiarism. No in-text referencing or reference list is required.

The following sanctions will apply when these instructions were not adhered to:

However, all answers provided must be in the own words and writing style of the student. If an answer or any section thereof is copied from another source it will be regarded as plagiarism.
